



ARIZONA STATEMENT OF CITIZENSHIP ALIEN STATUS FOR STATE PUBLIC BENEFITS

DIRECTIONS: ALL APPLICANTS MUST COMPLETE **SECTIONS I, II, AND IV**. APPLICANTS WHO ARE NOT U.S. CITIZENS OR NATIONALS MUST ALSO COMPLETE SECTION III. TYPE OR PRINT IN BLUE OR BLACK INK. ANSWER ALL QUESTIONS. ANSWER "NONE" OR "N/A" IF IT IS THE CORRECT RESPONSE.

Title IV of the federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 (the "Act"), 8 U.S.C. § 1621, provides that, with certain exceptions, only United States citizens, United States non-citizen nationals, non-exempt "qualified aliens" (and sometimes only particular categories of qualified aliens), nonimmigrants, and certain aliens paroled into the United States are eligible to receive state or local public benefits. With certain exceptions, a professional license and commercial license issued by a State agency is a State public benefit.

[Arizona Revised Statutes § 41-1080](#) requires, in general, that a person applying for a license must submit documentation to the licensing agency that satisfactorily demonstrates that the applicant's presence in the United States is authorized under federal law.

Submit this completed form and a copy of one or more document(s) from the attached "[Evidence of U.S. Citizenship, U.S. National Status, or Alien Status](#)," with your application for license or renewal.

IMPORTANT: If the document you submit DOES NOT contain a photograph, you must also provide a government-issued document that contains your photograph. You must submit supporting legal documentation (i.e., a marriage certificate) if the name on your evidence is not the same as your current legal name.

Otherwise Lawfully Present

PLEASE NOTE: The federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act may make persons in this category ineligible for licensure. See 8 U.S.C. § 1621(a).
